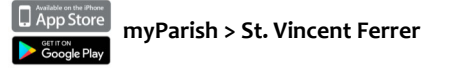

LECTURAS DE LA MISA DEL DOMINGO

PRIMERA LECTURA— 2 MC 7, 1-2. 9-14

En aquellos días, arrestaron a siete hermanos junto con su madre. El rey Antíoco Epífanés los hizo azotar para obligarlos a comer carne de puerco, prohibida por la ley. Uno de ellos, hablando en nombre de todos, dijo: "¿Qué quieres saber de nosotros? Estamos dispuestos a morir antes que quebrantar la ley de nuestros padres".

El rey se enfureció y lo mandó matar. Cuando el segundo de ellos estaba para morir, le dijo al rey: "Asesino, tú nos arrancas la vida presente, pero el rey del universo nos resucitará a una vida eterna, puesto que morimos por fidelidad a sus leyes".

Después comenzaron a burlarse del tercero. Presentó la lengua como se lo exigieron, extendió las manos con firmeza y declaró con fiabilidad: "De Dios recibí estos miembros y por amor a su ley los desprecio, y de él espero recobrarlos". El rey y sus acompañantes quedaron impresionados por el valor con que aquel muchacho despreciaba los tormentos.

Una vez muerto éste, sometieron al cuarto a torturas semejantes. Estando ya para expirar, dijo: "Vale la pena morir a manos de los hombres, cuando se tiene la firme esperanza de que Dios nos resucitará. Tú, en cambio, no resucitarás para la vida".

R. (15b) Al despertar, Señor, contemplaré tu rostro.

SEGUNDA LECTURA— 2 TES 2, 16-3, 5

Hermanos: Que el mismo Señor nuestro, Jesucristo, y nuestro Padre Dios, que nos ha amado y nos ha dado gratuitamente un consuelo eterno y una feliz esperanza, conforten los corazones de ustedes y los dispongan a toda clase de obras buenas y de buenas palabras.

Por lo demás, hermanos, oren por nosotros para que la palabra del Señor se propague con rapidez y sea recibida con honor, como aconteció entre ustedes. Oren también para que Dios nos libre de los hombres perversos y malvados que nos acosan, porque no todos aceptan la fe.

Pero el Señor, que es fiel, les dará fuerza a ustedes y los librándolos del maligno. Tengo confianza en el Señor de que ya hacen ustedes y continuarán haciendo cuanto les he mandado. Que el Señor dirija su corazón para que amen a Dios y esperen pacientemente la venida de Cristo.

EVANGELIO— LC 20, 27-38

En aquel tiempo, se acercaron a Jesús algunos saduceos. Como los saduceos niegan la resurrección de los muertos, le preguntaron: "Maestro, Moisés nos dejó escrito que si alguno tiene un hermano casado que muere sin haber tenido hijos, se case con la viuda para dar descendencia a su hermano. Hubo una vez siete hermanos, el mayor de los cuales se casó y murió sin dejar hijos. El segundo, el tercero y los demás, hasta el séptimo, tomaron por esposa a la viuda y todos murieron sin dejar sucesión. Por fin murió también la viuda. Ahora bien, cuando llegue la resurrección, ¿de cuál de ellos será esposa la mujer, pues los siete estuvieron casados con ella?"

Jesús les dijo: "En esta vida, hombres y mujeres se casan, pero en la vida futura, los que sean juzgados dignos de ella y de la resurrección de los muertos, no se casarán ni podrán ya morir, porque serán como los ángeles e hijos de Dios, pues él los habrá resucitado.

Y que los muertos resucitan, el mismo Moisés lo indica en el episodio de la zarza, cuando llama al Señor, Dios de Abraham, Dios de Isaac, Dios de Jacob. Porque Dios no es Dios de muertos, sino de vivos, pues para él todos viven".

VOTE "NO" ON PROPOSITION 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars. Prop 1 isn't needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation that would remain in effect without the amendment, including our current limit on late-term abortions that are permitted only for the life and health of the mother. ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

In today's Gospel we find that God is a God of the living, and this is indeed the core of our hope. Jesus has risen and is with us, therefore, at no time should we be without hope for the future.

When you give the furniture, household items and clothing you no longer use to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, you give hope to your neighbors who have nothing.

SUNDAY GOSPEL REFLECTION

In today's Gospel, we hear about an encounter between Jesus and some Sadducees. The Sadducees were a party of Judaism active in Jesus' time, descended from the priestly family of Zadok. They were literal interpreters of the written Law of Moses, which means that they were in disagreement with the position of the Pharisees, who offered an oral interpretation of the Law of Moses.

The Sadducees are described in this Gospel as opponents to the belief in resurrection. In the dialogue presented here, we see an example of the means of disputation that was common in first century Judaism. The Sadducees use the example of Levirate marriage, found in the Law of Moses, to disprove belief in the resurrection. According to Deuteronomy 25:5-10, if a man died without producing an heir, the man's brother should marry his wife and the offspring of this union would inherit the property and carry on the name of the man who had died. The Sadducees use this as an example to challenge belief in the resurrection.

Jesus argues from the same written Law of Moses to show that there is resurrection. Using the texts from the Book of Exodus (Chapter 3) that describe Moses' encounter with God in the burning bush, Jesus shows that God is the God of the living, not the dead. Here Jesus uses the same method and texts of the Sadducees to counter them. As the Gospel text suggests, he beat them at their own game!

More importantly, in this discourse Jesus shows the limits of our imaginations when it comes to eternal life. The Sadducees argued against resurrection because of the limits of earthly existence. They did not imagine another possibility for existence and relationship with God. Jesus proposes that the possibilities of resurrected life are beyond our imaginations. Jesus' conclusion suggests something else as well: To spend time worrying about resurrected life is to miss the point. The point is eternal relationship with God is possible, for God is the God of the living, ". . . for to him all are alive."
